The Pine Valley Community Survey 2003 was prepared and conducted by the Pine Valley Historical Advisory Committee during February and March, 2003. The survey questionnaire was mailed to 550 Pine Valley property owners. Two hundred four (204) questionnaires were returned.

Item 5 - "Speeding vehicles"


Item 7 - "Unlawful/unsafe behavior by OHV riders"

The survey results on these three questions are show in the Figures 1 - 4. The total responses on each of the items was: Item 3 177, Item 5 180. And Item 7 181.


Figure 2 shows the response to item one by residency status. (Full Time, Part Time, Weekend/Coccsiond).




Off Highway Vehicles on Streets and Roads













Pine Valley Community Survey 2003 Individual Comments Updated May 7,2003

<u>Off Highway Vehides</u>

Off road vehicles continue to be an irritant in our neighborhood. (26) East Valley

Some one we dways have - GET RID OF THE 4 WHEELERS IN OUR RESIDENTIAL AREAS!!! & We need a full-time cop. (26) West Valley

We need to be able to ride OHV from our home to the west BLM land and to north to pinto road and Grass Valley road without fear of being stopped or harassed. Roads and trails should be established. *(26) West Valley*

Get rid of irresponsible 4-wheel drivers! Also need more speed limit signs and enforcement of laws. (26) Town Site

Something must be done about incessant and uncontrolled OHVS! (26) North Valley

Isn't there a law against ATV, etc, on paved streets or even within the Pine Valley Community residential area? (26) Location not marked.

AT Vs on residential roads - our largest concern and NO law enforcement. (26) East Valley

We need more control on AVTs youth that ride them. Its out of control on our streets. Some one is going to <u>be Killed</u> if not looked into. (26) West Valley

Barking dogs, four wheelers on dusty roads. (26) Town Site

The ATV problems should be addressed! "No ATV on aity streets." (26) East Valley

Keep AT V use out of residential areas – BAN – some as they do in the forest compground. (26) West Valley

I would favor keeping our little community quiet, quaint, dean and not commercial. A good example of "what can happen" is Duck Creek on Cedar Mountain— motorcycles, 4 wheelers everywhere, day and night. Noise, dust, wrecks are common daily occurrence. What a shame!
